- 3. When you think of the people in the Bible, what type of people come to your mind? Do you picture people with neat or messy lives?
- 4. Read **Luke 22:54-62**. What stands out to you in Peter's response to Jesus? Has there ever been a time where you felt it was tough to live out your faith?
- 5. Have you ever felt like you were too far gone to be accepted by God? Has there ever been an area of your life that you felt was too messy for God to do anything with?
- 6. The lyrics to Death was Arrested say, "Alone in my sorrow and dead in my sin. Lost without hope with no place to begin." Are there lyrics to certain songs that resonate with your emotions when you think of Jesus?

## **Dive In Questions**

- 3. Read Matthew 26:31-35. What stands out to you in Peter's response to Jesus? Have you ever felt like Peter in these moments?
- 4. Read the story of **John 21:15-17**. Jesus was not forgiving Peter, as he had already done that. At this moment, Jesus helped Peter know that he was forgiven. How do you think Peter felt at the end of this interaction with Jesus?
- 5. How do you think Peter's experiences with Jesus - both the highs and the lows impacted how he led in the church later in his life? Has a messy situation in your past impacted how you view your relationship with God now?
